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
The way we purchase and consume goods has evolved

The evolution of warehouse management

To meet dynamic supply chain demands, your facility needs to perform three key functions:







1 Storage

All kinds of industries use warehouses to store items relevant to their business.

Examples

- Ingredients used in the production of a large-scale bakery
- Law or accounting firm documents that need to be archived
- Medical supplies and consumables for a hospital
- Retail products for redistribution to nearby outlets

The design and capabilities of your own warehouse depends on how you manage inventory and storage requirements. Some warehouses are automated, using robotics and technology to improve efficiency and reduce labour costs. Additionally, warehouses can be climate-controlled to accommodate refrigeration or temperature-sensitive products. On-demand warehouse operations offer short-term storage, inventory management, and transportation.

2 Distribution

Distribution plays a crucial role in connecting your goods to stores or outlets.

In this model, a distribution centre receives items, temporarily stores them, then ships them to various destinations. Sometimes shipments from multiple suppliers are broken down and consolidated into smaller quantities of mixed goods geared to a final destination. These centres are typically part of a network of facilities and may also send items to fulfillment centres dedicated to online shopping. Depending on your industry, there are different types of distribution centres for different needs. Some use people and mobile equipment to move things around, while others use mechanical systems like conveyors and sorting machines. They may also have machines or robots to handle the material.

3 Fulfillment

If your business model includes getting products into the hands of individual customers, your facility will need fulfillment capabilities.

Fulfillment centres specialize in handling tasks related to online orders for business-to-consumer transactions. As their storage spaces stock inventory from different sellers, fulfillment centres offer a variety of services such as product selection, packaging, assembling, and labeling (just like Amazon). Fulfillment centres are often managed by third-party (3PL) logistics providers.
